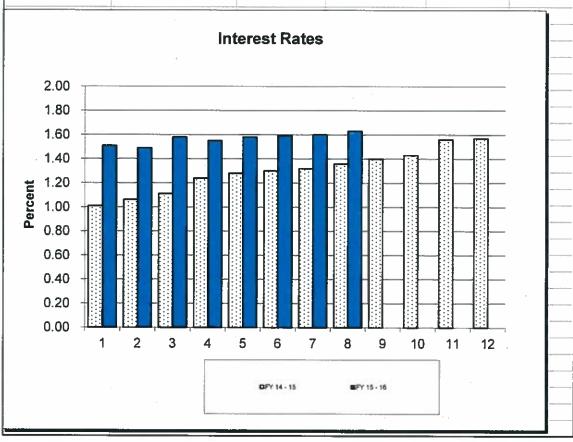

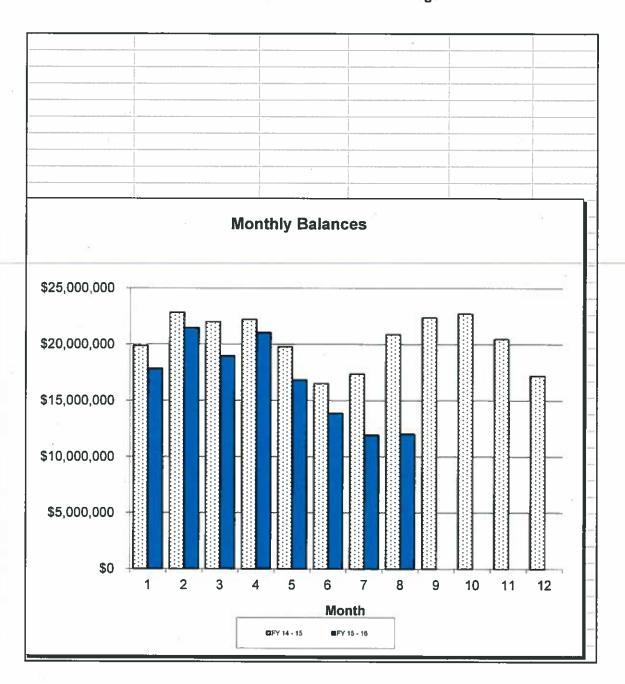

Reading has yet to determine their tool so that cost is unknown. The \$25.00 fee is to offset these costs.
