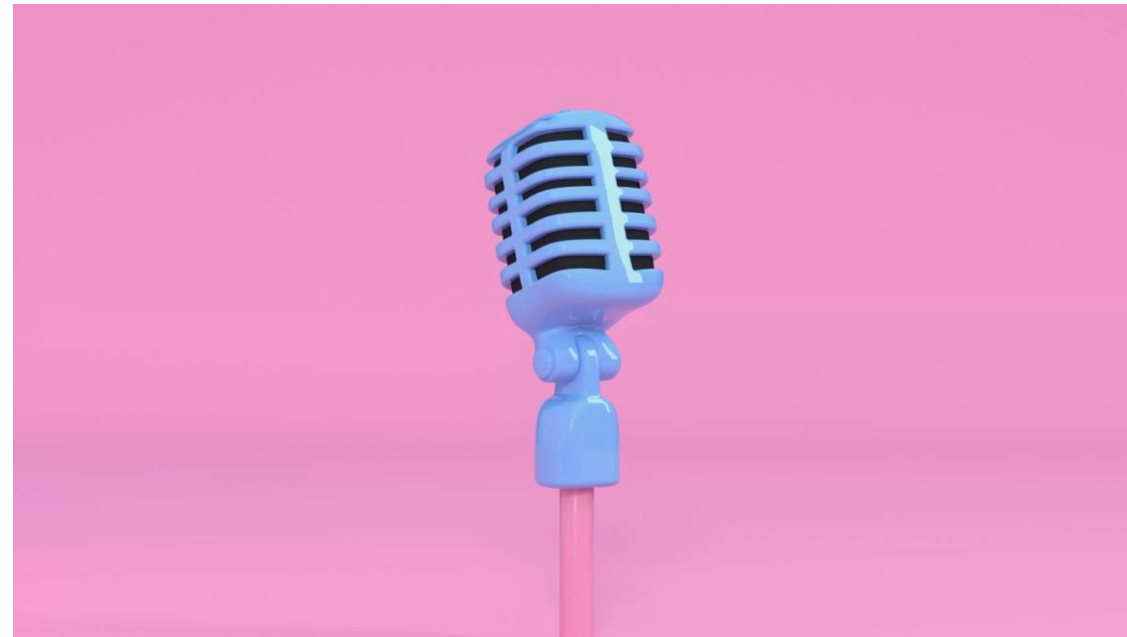

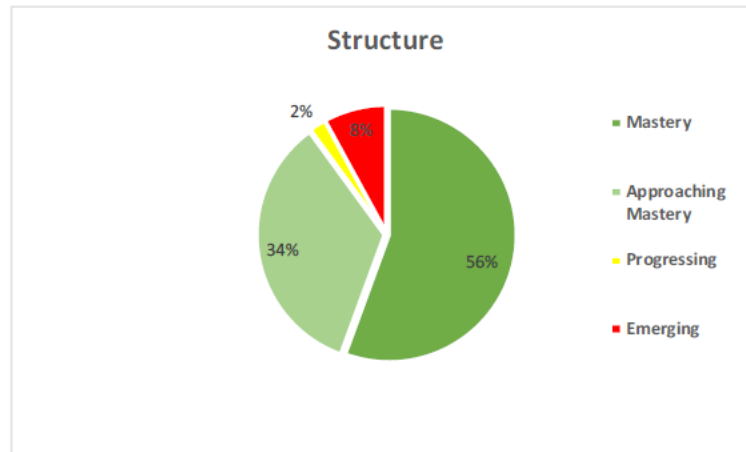

Writing Communication Results

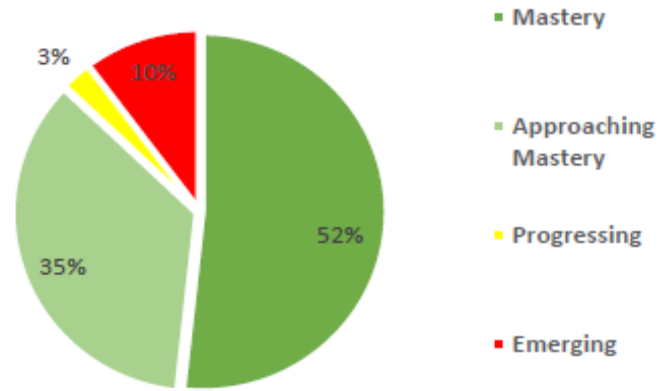
Spring 2022

In the Spring of 2022, 27 SSC faculty assessed over 400 students using the Written Communication rubric in D2L Brightspace. The results from those assessments indicate that a majority of students (88%) scored in the “Mastery” and “Approaching Mastery” categories of performance. Alternatively, the remaining students assessed (12%) scored either in the “Progressing” or “Emerging” levels of performance.

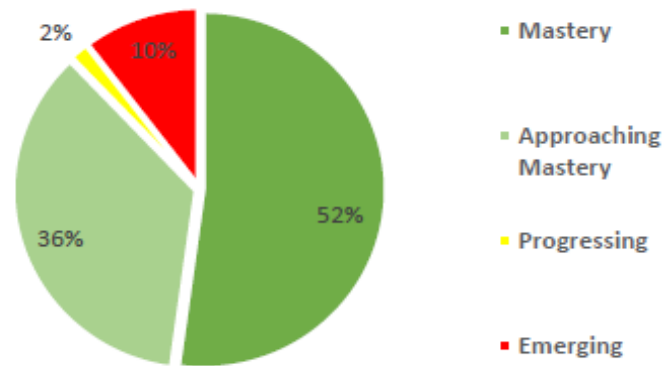
The dimensions of the Written Communication rubric (Attachment A) consist of three levels of performance on which students were assessed: Structure, Content, and Style & Mechanics. While the measurements indicate positive outcomes, the data are one snapshot in time and do not reveal any overall trends since the transition to the new LMS.

Style & Mechanics

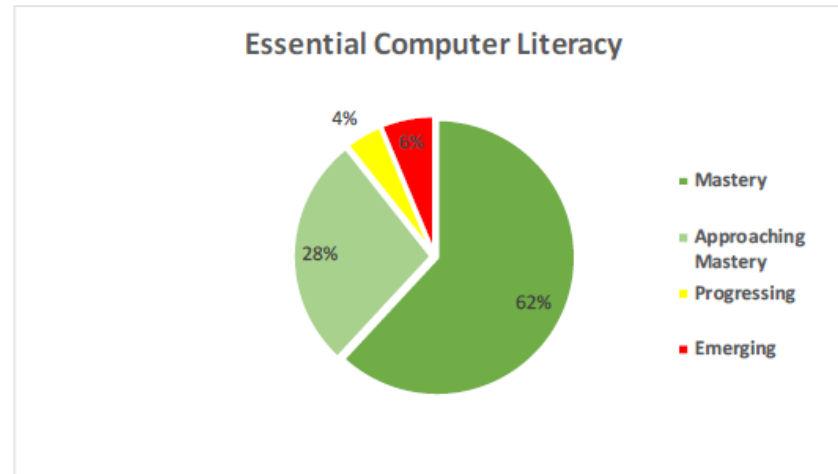


Technology Results

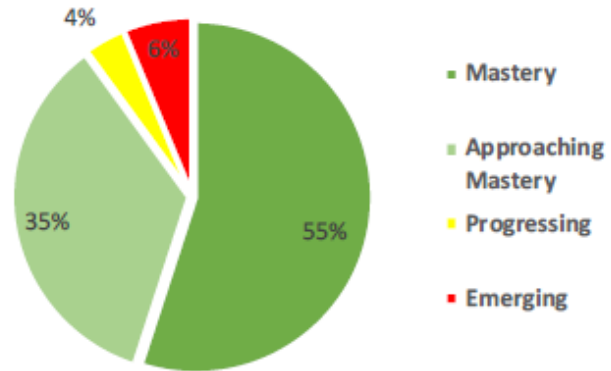
Spring 2022

In the Spring of 2022, 11 SSC faculty assessed over 40 students using the Technology rubric (Attachment B) in D2L Brightspace. The results from those assessments indicate that a majority of students (84%) scored in the “Mastery” and “Approaching Mastery” categories of performance. Alternatively, the remaining students assessed (16%) scored either in the “Progressing” or “Emerging” levels of performance.

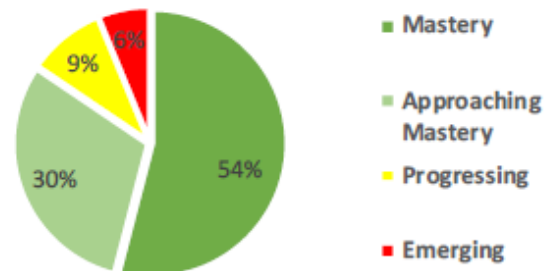
The dimensions of the Technology rubric consist of four levels of performance on which students were assessed: Essential Computer Literacy, Use of Online/Technological Tools, Use of General Purpose/Discipline Specific Software or Technology to Complete Tasks, and Critical Thinking Skills Using Technology. While measurements appear to indicate positive outcomes, it is important to keep in mind the relatively small sample size when drawing conclusions. Of course, the data also represent one snapshot of performance and do not reveal any overall trends given the transition to the new LMS.



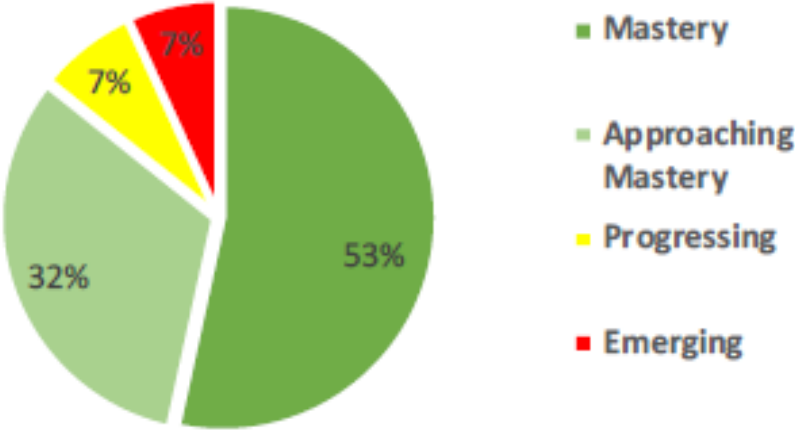
Use of Online/Technological Tools

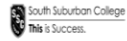
